I. Theatrical Design

Scenic Design:

The art of set or scenic design is a collaborative process involving working with the director, costume, lighting and sound designers, technical director properties and paint artisans in translating the work of the playwright into a physical representation of the words, plot, characters, and themes. This translation involves synthesizing the historic architectural and decorative arts of the period with the dramatic action conceived by the director. Color, line, shape, form texture, composition, rhythm, and movement are the tools used by the designers. The perspective painting or model that is the result of this interpretive process is a guide or map for the director in the understanding the design.

Once approved the designer drafts scaled architectural style elevations of all scenic units for the carpenters, painters and prop masters to use in the building process. The designer then supervises the gathering and building of properties including draperies, furniture, glassware, and even live animals. In the rehearsal process the designer is often active in helping actors to understand the use of scenic pieces and for the stage crews to shift scenes. The designer works to enhance the actors without calling undo attention to the design itself. The design is not truly completed until all the components of actors, costumes, lighting, sound, and scenery are assembled on stage in front of an audience.

In an academic setting the designer's work also includes the teaching of each step in the design process to the students while serving as a role model of professional behavior.
